ROUTES OF ENTRY AND EMERGENCY FIRST AID PROCEDURES

- 1. **Inhalation:** No hazard under normal conditions. If necessary move victim to fresh air. If symptoms persist, call a physician. Administer CPR if necessary.
- 2. **Eyes:** Flush eyes with running water for 15 minutes. If redness persists, seek medical attention
- 3. **Skin:** Remove contaminated clothing, wash with clean water and soap. Put on clean clothes.

SECTION 7- SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS AND SPILL/LEAK PROCEDURES

Precautions to be Taken

Handling and Storage: Store in cool ventilated place away from fire hazards, excessive heat, flammable or easily oxidizable materials. Do not allow product to dry out.

Other Precautions: Do not allow product to go below 35 degrees. Apply product in open areas. Keep away from children and pets. Do not contaminate feed, seed or any water sources.

Steps to be taken in

case of Release or Spill: Dike area and maximize recovery. Pump into a tank or absorb with diatomaceous earth or sand. Sweep up and place into containers for land application at recommended rates. Prevent entry into sewer or waterways.

Environmental

Precautions: Relatively low toxicity to fish and aquatic organisms. Do not contaminate any waterway, lake, stream or estuary by direct application of cleaning of equipment or disposal. Triple rinse containers and offer for recycling or dispose of in an approved landfill. Consult Federal, state and local regulations for proper disposal.
